

During these lessons in the Spring Half Term, students were asked to be proactive and think creatively to help support their community through these challenging and unprecedented times.

At the beginning of Lockdown 3.0, Year 8 researched different charities and creative fundraising ideas to help understand the

importance of charity fundraising. After sharing their ideas, they voted to fundraise for one charity collectively, Cancer Research UK.



Coming up

How The Uniform Swapping Works

- 1. Students will bring uniform to school on selected days (Parents will be sent a letter listing the days). The uniform needs to be good quality, clean and folded. It can be any item of the uniform, including PE kit.
- Students will swap for another item of clothing they need. Swap depends on availability of items for swapping. Swaps cannot be returned after the event. Donations can also be taken without swaps.
