The past year has been difficult for everyone no matter what the individual personal circumstances are. There have been points where everybody, including myself, has felt like there is no light at the end of the tunnel. During these times it is difficult to make sure that we continue to push to have a positive mindset. With a positive mindset it will not make this time go any quicker but it will make things a little easier. During both lockdowns I have found what has supported my mental health is by following the example of the Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) award.



The DofE is broken down into various sections, but the three main ones are physical, skill and volunteering. The Westgate School now has over well 100 students doing the DofE across four different year groups. It has been fantastic to see that even during our second lockdown students are striving to complete the DofE. Not only because I know doing the different sections help with

positive mindset, but also because of the support our students are offering the local community by doing volunteer work. Students have been involved in writing supportive letters to care home patients as well as, with their family, making food deliveries to houses for some of the most vulnerable and key workers in our community.

Here are some pictures of the amazing work done 'Screen free' both at home and at school with our keyworker students:






























Fantastic Fundraising
